Minutes of the Meeting of the Todd County Board of Commissioners held on December 9th, 2022

Call to Order

The Todd County Board of Commissioners met in the Commissioner's Board Room in the City of Long Prairie, MN on the 9th day of December, 2022 at 9:00 AM. The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Erickson. The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance. All Commissioners were present.

Approval of Agenda

On motion by Becker and second by Kneisl, the following motion was introduced and adopted by unanimous vote: To approve the agenda as presented with the addition of item 10.7 2022-2024 LELS Road Deputy Contract, item 10.8 2022-2024 Teamsters Sheriff's Supervisors Contract, item 10.9 2022-2024 Teamsters Jail/Dispatch Contract and item 6.2 Ag Society.

Consent Agenda

On motion by Kneisl and second by Kircher, the following motions and resolution were introduced and adopted by unanimous vote:

To approve the Todd County Board of Commissioner's Meeting Minutes for November 15th, 2022 as presented.

Auditor-Treasurer

On motion by Becker and second by Neumann, the following motion was introduced and adopted by unanimous rollcall vote: To approve the November 2022 Auditor Warrants number (ACH) 902758 through 902844 in the amount of \$2,025,029.66, (Manual) 766 through 775 in the amount of \$126,255.53 and (Regular) 240173 through 240306 in the amount of \$675,020.98 for a total of \$2,826,306.17.

**DESIGNATING POLLING PLACES FOR ABSENTEE & MAIL BALLOT PRECINCTS
WITHIN TODD COUNTY FOR THE 2023 ELECTION YEAR**

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statutes 204B.16, subd 1 requires, by ordinance or resolution, to designate on an annual basis the polling places to be utilized for the upcoming year, and;

WHEREAS, it is important that the citizens of Todd County are provided accessible and equipped polling locations to exercise their right to vote, and;

WHEREAS, changes to the polling place location may be made at least 90 days before the next election if the authorized polling place becomes unavailable for use, and;

WHEREAS, changes to the polling place locations may be made in the case of an emergency when it is necessary to ensure a safe and secure location for voting pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 204B.175 and 204B.181.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Todd County Board of Commissioners hereby designates the following polling place for the Todd County Absentee Precinct and the City of Swanville's Mail Ballot Precinct for elections conducted in 2023 to be:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in the event that the County of Todd would require to call a special election not held on the day of a statewide election that the polling places of the County's Municipalities along with the Todd County Absentee Precinct will be utilized dependent on the needs of the County of Todd.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Todd County Auditor-Treasurer is hereby authorized to designate a replacement polling place meeting the requirements of Minnesota Statutes for the polling place designated herewith if said place becomes unavailable for use by the County of Todd.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Todd County Auditor-Treasurer is hereby authorized to designate an emergency replacement polling place meeting the requirements of Minnesota Statutes for any polling place designated in this resolution when necessary to ensure a safe and secure location for voting.



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On motion by Kircher and second by Becker, the following motion was introduced and adopted by unanimous vote: To approve the contract with Peters Law Office for Public Defender services in Todd County for 2023.

The Todd County Board of Commissioners interviewed candidate Eugene Mensen for the Sauk River Watershed Board of Managers open position.

On motion by Neumann and second by Becker, the following motion was introduced and adopted by unanimous vote: To appoint Eugene Mensen to the Sauk River Watershed District Board of Managers for the remainder of a three year term beginning immediately through July 1, 2024.

Facilities Committee

On motion by Becker and second by Neumann, the following motion was introduced and adopted by majority rollcall vote with Becker, Erickson, Kneisl and Neumann for and Kircher against: To approve the recommendation of the Facilities Committee to move forward with the low bid from BCI Construction of \$1,510,069 for the Justice Center Roof and Rooftops project with the entire project funded with the ARP Funding.

Ag Society

On motion by Kircher, the following resolution was introduced and tabled until the County Attorney comes back with a Memorandum of Understanding to return to the December 20, 2022 meeting if ready for review and consideration:

TODD COUNTY AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY/FAIR BOARD JUST CELEBRATED 137 YEARS AS A STRONG COMMUNITY EVENT

WHEREAS, Continued impact to finances and grounds, is part of the responsibility of Todd County Agricultural Society. As an example relationship with Todd County Public Works for setup and take down of grandstand events such as: Demolition Derby and/or Truck and Tractor Pull, and

WHEREAS, Solution to alleviate, Todd County Agricultural Society has purchased 75 cement barriers consisting of size 2 ft x 2 ft x 6 ft. These to be used in place of dirt berm,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, We make a formal request to leave the cement barriers on the Todd County Fairgrounds and Todd County Agricultural Society retain ownership. Todd County Agricultural Society assumes responsibility for placement for events and storage after events. Barriers to be placed inside and against north grandstand fence.

On motion by Kneisl and second by Becker, the following resolution was introduced and adopted by majority rollcall vote with Becker, Kneisl, Kircher and Neumann for and Erickson against:

TODD EXPO ARENA IS AN INTEGRAL PART OF THE TODD COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS

WHEREAS, Appreciation for upgrades and remodeling of the existing building by the Todd County Agricultural Society/Fair Board and attendees of this cultural tradition held each year, and



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WHEREAS, Overhead door east end of Todd Expo Arena is misplaced and needs to be reinstalled as was existing prior to renovation,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Todd County Agricultural Society is requesting that it be placed back to original 90 degree angle configuration without an air flow test. This would allow for enhanced air movement within the building and utilization of existing exhaust fan. For healthier environment for exhibits, exhibitors, and spectators.

Emergency Management

On motion by Kircher and second by Kneisl, the following resolution was introduced and adopted by unanimous vote:

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING PARTICIPATION IN PLANNING PROCESS

WHEREAS, the County of Todd is participating in a hazard mitigation planning process as established under the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000; and

WHEREAS, the Act establishes a framework for the development of a multi- jurisdictional hazard mitigation plan; and

WHEREAS, the Act as part of the planning process requires public involvement and local coordination among neighboring local units of government and business; and

WHEREAS, the county will lead the planning effort with the assistance of consultants and State of Minnesota mitigation staff.

WHEREAS, the county will provide staff and resources from departments related to mitigation, will facilitate participation of jurisdiction within the county, and provide quarterly reporting on plan progress.

WHEREAS, the plan must include a risk assessment including past hazards, hazards that threaten the county, maps of hazards, an estimate of structures at risk, estimate of potential dollar losses for each hazard, a general description of land uses and future development trends; and

WHEREAS, the plan must include a mitigation strategy including goals and objectives and an action plan identifying specific mitigation projects and costs; and

WHEREAS, the plan must include a maintenance or implementation process including plan updates, integration of plan into other planning documents and how the county will maintain public participation and coordination; and

WHEREAS, the draft plan will be shared with the State of Minnesota and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for coordination of state and federal review and comment on the draft; and

WHEREAS, approval of the all hazard mitigation plan will make the county eligible to receive Hazard Mitigation Assistance grants as they become available; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Todd County will enter into an agreement with the Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management in the Minnesota Department of Public Safety for the program entitled Hazard Mitigation Assistance (HMA) for the update of the Todd County



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Hazard Mitigation plan. Michael Wisniewski, Emergency Management Director is hereby authorized to execute and sign such agreements and any amendments hereto as are necessary to implement the plan on behalf of Todd County.

County Sheriff

On motion by Kircher and second by Kneisl, the following motion was introduced and adopted by unanimous vote: To approve Lonnie Marcyes return to his former position of Sergeant effective January 2, 2023 at Grade 11, Step 9.

Health & Human Services

Laura Vaughn from Northern Pines Mental Health Center provided an update on the services being provided in Todd County.

On motion by Kneisl and second by Neumann, the following motion was introduced and adopted by unanimous vote: To approve salary adjustment for CHS rotating Administrator for calendar years 2023 and 2024.

Administration

On motion by Kneisl and second by Kircher, the following resolution was introduced and adopted by unanimous vote:

Set 2023 Non-Union Employee/Appointed Officials Salaries

WHEREAS, the Todd County Board of Commissioners are responsible for setting the compensation of county employees, elected officials, appointed officials and board members, and;

WHEREAS, the Todd County Board of Commissioners desire to follow the same pattern bargained with unions for the non-union county employees and appointed officials, and;

WHEREAS, the agreements include a 2.5% general increase effective the first full pay period worked in January, 2023, pay date January 25, 2023, and a 3% step increase effective the first full pay period worked in July, 2023, pay date July 26, 2023 for eligible staff. Staff currently over the maximum of the salary grid shall receive a 1.25% (one-half general increase) effective the first full pay period worked in January, 2023 pay date January 25, 2023 in accordance with county policy.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Todd County Board of Commissioners authorize a 2.5% general increase effective the first full pay period worked in January, 2023, pay date January 25, 2023, and a 3% step increase effective the first full pay period worked in July 2023, and pay date July 26, 2023 for eligible staff. Staff currently over the maximum of the salary grid shall receive a 1.25% (one-half general increase) effective the first full pay period worked in January, 2023 pay date January 25, 2023 in accordance with county policy.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Todd County Board of Commissioners approve setting the County Auditor/Treasurer salary at \$100,682 in 2023.
